



York Summary

- York has 204,439 residents with 9.8% from a black and minority ethnic community group. 83.9% are in good health, with 15.3% stating that they have some limitation in day to day activities.
- £537.41 was the Average Weekly Household Income in 2011/2012 (£405.83 in 2007/2008).
- 66% own their own home, either outright or with a mortgage, 18% are private renters and 14% are social tenants.
- 73.5% of residents have a NVQ level 1 - 4 qualification and 18.0% have no qualifications at all.
- 10.6% of children live in poverty and there are 9.0% of households in fuel poverty.
- 6.2% of the working population (aged 16-64) claim out of work benefits and 0.5% claim job seekers allowance.


Ward Summary

- Holgate has 12,842 residents with 8.3% from a black and minority ethnic community group. 84.3% are in good health, with 14.0% stating that they have some limitation in day to day activities.
- £526.10 was the Average Weekly Household Income in 2011/2012 (£390.00 in 2007/2008).
- 63% own their own home, either outright or with a mortgage, 23% are private renters and 12% are social tenants.
- 73.7% of residents have a NVQ level 1 - 4 qualification and 17.3% have no qualifications at all.
- 11.8% of children live in poverty and there are 9.9% of households in fuel poverty.
- 6.1% of the working population claim out of work benefits and 0.6% claim job seekers allowance.





Population by Age








Hours Worked









Household Composition






Benefit Claimant Numbers Working age Population (16-64)


Benefit Claimant Rate Working age Population (16-64)

Total Benefit Claimant Rate (Age and Gender) Working age Population (16-64)







JSA Claimant Numbers





JSA and Universal Credit (out of work) Claimant Rate Working age Population (16-64)





Child Poverty


The proportion of children living in families in receipt of out-of-work (means-tested) benefits or in receipt of tax credits where their reported income is less than 60 per cent of UK median income.

Fuel Poverty


A household is said to be fuel poor if it needs to spend more than 10% of its income on fuel to maintain an adequate standard of warmth.

Pension Credit is an income-related benefit made up of 2 parts - Guarantee Credit and Savings Credit.






The IMD measures and rates a number of different domains affecting quality of life including income, employment, education and skills, health and disability, crime, barriers to services and quality of living environments.













Total Crime and Total Anti-Social Behaviour per 1,000 population





ASB per 1,000 population




Crime Rate per 1,000 population


Average Weekly Homecare Hours by Client Type and Age




Homecare Clients by Type and Age





<p>Experian Groups</p> <p>J Rental Hubs</p> <p>Aged 18-35, private renting, singles and sharers, urban locations, young neighbourhoods.</p>
<p>L Transient Renters</p> <p>Private renters, low length of residence, low cost housing, singles and sharers, older terraces.</p>
<p>F Senior Security</p> <p>Elderly singles and couples, homeowners, comfortable homes, additional pensions above state, don't like new technology.</p>
<p>H Aspiring Homemakers</p> <p>Younger households, full-time employment, private suburbs, affordable housing costs, starter salaries.</p>
<p>E Suburban Stability</p> <p>Older families, some adult children at home, suburban mid-range homes, 3 bedrooms, have lived at same address some years.</p>
<p>I Urban Cohesion</p> <p>Settled extended families, city suburbs, multicultural, own 3 bedroom homes, sense of community.</p>
<p>D Domestic Success</p> <p>Families with children, upmarket suburban homes, owned with a mortgage, 3 or 4 bedrooms, high internet use.</p>
<p>Experian Types</p> <p>L52 Midlife Stopgap</p> <p>Homesharers and singles, in employment, don't have children, average age 45, privately renting affordable homes.</p>
<p>J40 Career Builders</p> <p>Most aged 26-35, singles and cohabiting couples, good incomes from career jobs, rent /own nice apartments, pleasant neighbourhoods.</p>
<p>H35 Primary Ambitions</p> <p>Cohabiting couples with children, aged 26-45, good household incomes, own with a mortgage, 2 or 3 bedroom terraces or semis.</p>
<p>I39 Ageing Access</p> <p>Average age 63, often living alone, most are homeowners, modest income, 1 or 2 bed flats and terraces.</p>
<p>F25 Classic Grandparents</p> <p>Elderly couples, traditional views, not good with new technology, most likely to have a basic mobile, long length of residence.</p>
<p>E21 Family Ties</p> <p>Parents aged 41-55, adult children at home, often students, also have a child under 18, own semi or detached homes, supporting kids can cause money strains.</p>
<p>J41 Central Pulse</p> <p>Aged under 35, city centre regeneration, rent small new build and converted flats, graduate starter salaries, most frequent cinema goers.</p>
<p>O63 Streetwise Singles</p> <p>Singles and sharers, low cost social flats, 1 or 2 bedrooms, urban and fringe locations, routine occupations.</p>
<p>J45 Bus-Route Renters</p> <p>Aged 25 to 40, living alone or sharing, rent lower value flats, often 1 bed, often live near main roads, further from central amenities.</p>
<p>L50 Renting a Room</p> <p>Singles and homesharers, short term private renters, low rent accommodation, often victorian terraces, most likely to get a lift to work.</p>
